Bullying vs. Peer Conflict

• Bullying occurs when persistent remarks or behavior create a power imbalance and seriously jeopardize a child's right to a safe and caring learning environment. In the event that a student is repeatedly harassed, it is important for the student or the parent to report it to the classroom teacher immediately. Administration should be informed if the behavior continues.

<u>Discipline</u>

• Discipline is a learning process and not simply an event where consequences are applied. Discipline is about preparing children for all the choices they will be making and ensuring they are ready to handle them. CES students are expected to respect all adults in our building.

Dress Code

- Students are required to wear shoes at all times.
- Wear indoor shoes appropriate for physical education classes.
- Clothing should be school appropriate in terms of weather, language written on shirts, etc. and not be revealing in any way.

Dropping off - Picking up

- Students leaving the school for any reason during school hours must be signed in/out at the office by a parent/adult.
- Please arrange a safe meeting spot with your child. Options include the front foyer, a bench at the front, at a certain piece of playground equipment or at the flagpoles. Also please make a "Plan B" with your child. This will help them deal with something out of the normal routine. "Plan B" for us is always come inside to the office where students will be safe, we can call parents, page a sibling, et cetera.

The Family School Wellness Program

• The Family School Wellness Program is a confidential, voluntary, preventative service offered to children, youth and families.

Field Trips

- Field trips are offered at various times throughout the school year at every grade level. This is a wonderful opportunity to learn and grow with your child. Please arrange care for siblings. Information and consent forms about each trip will be communicated via email to parents/guardians.
- Parent volunteers are required to submit a current police record check and child intervention check to attend the class field trip with your child.

Fire Drills/Lock Downs

- In order that students may know how to act quickly and without confusion in case of an emergency, fire drills and lock downs will be held throughout the year.
- It is important that the building be evacuated quickly and quietly.
- Instructions are posted in each room regarding exits to be used.
- Teachers will review lock down key messages and procedures with all students well before the first drill so the younger ones are well aware of what to expect.

Parking

- When dropping your child off use the hug and go loop.
- Parking use marked visitor parking stalls. Alternate parking areas are available at the ball diamond or the community hall.
- If you are parking in the **back alley** you need to be parked along the fence facing **east**.
- The speed limit in the back alley is 20 Km/h.

- If you are using this area, please pick up your child at the north doors and take them to your car so they are not navigating through the parked cars on their own. Our CES students are generally very small and they may not be visible to drivers.
- Please be courteous! Do not block a garage entrance or driveways at any time.
- Our local peace officers will be monitoring this area! You might be ticketed or towed if there are violations.

<u>Peanut, "Nut" Aware</u>
